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Mid-Missouri CHE Minimum Standards of Conduct

1. All Mid-MO CHE events are chaperoned by parents. Students are expected to respect and comply with the parent leaders.
2. The Mid-MO CHE board strongly encourages that members who actively exhibit contagious illness refrain from attending an event.
3. No alcohol, smoking, drugs or anything that could cause harm to oneself or others.
4. Good manners and respect for others through words and actions are required. No cursing, rude talk, gossip, or excessive teasing.
5. No public displays of affection (PDA). Mid-MO CHE activities are not for match-making purposes. Our events are designed for "group," not "couple" activities.
6. Respect the property where the event is taking place and clean up after yourself.
7. Dress modestly and appropriately. The purpose of the event will dictate the clothing expected. We realize that standards of dress vary. However, we are reminding all attendees that these are Christian events. As such, the Biblical admonitions to dress modestly apply.
8. Please RSVP promptly if the event coordinator requests one. Do not show up unannounced. Please notify event coordinator of cancellations ASAP for events requiring RSVP.
9. If a youth disobeys the guidelines set forth above:
 - a. He/she will be spoken to by an adult host;
 - b. If the objectionable behavior continues, he/she will be spoken to by 2 to 3 adult hosts, and their parents if present.
 - c. If the objectionable behavior continues, the parent will be contacted and the youth must be removed from the activity. If a parent picks up a youth from an activity for unacceptable behavior, the youth will be welcomed back to the next event if he/she agrees to behave according to the guidelines. If a parent is called and does not come and pick up the youth from the activity in a timely manner, the youth will not be welcome back to these events the rest of the school year

Committees members are required to faithfully attend committee meeting called by the committee chair and help plan, organize and execute the event to which they are assigned. Committee members are required to participate the event to which they are assigned. Event dates will be added to the calendar as soon as possible.

For new members

Yahoo will send you an invitation to join the CHEconnection Yahoo Group after the moderator has added your name to our membership roster. You must have a Yahoo profile and accept that invitation to join or you won't be added by Yahoo. 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CHE Events and Committees Descriptions/ Service Options

All events described depend on members to lead and complete. Events will not be held without adequate staffing. Due to the nature of some service areas, members filling some needs are selected by the board or an appointed representative of the board and are not listed on the application. Committee chairs secure locations, honor deadlines for applications as applicable, collect registrations and fees when applicable, and delegate tasks to committee participants.

Committee members are required to faithfully participate in committee meetings called by the committee chair and help plan, organize and execute the event to which they are assigned. Committee members are required to participate in the event to which they are assigned. Committee member tasks include advertising event(s), setting up the site, cleaning up afterwards, preparing & serving refreshments, sharing photos with yearbook staff, other duties as assigned. Event dates will be added to the calendar as soon as possible. **Please be prepared to arrange your schedule so that you may help your committee partners facilitate the event.**

CHE Committees

- **Ice Cream Social/Late August:** Kick off the new school year with information/business meeting regarding local resources and MMCHE events.
- **Ladies' Encouragement Tea/Mid-September:** A time for encouragement and fellowship with other homeschool teachers.
- **Men's Fellowship Breakfast/TBA:** A time for mutual encouragement and discussion on how to be better homeschool fathers.
- **Fall Festival/Early October:** Potluck picnic with opportunities to meet new friends and reconnect with old friends!
- **Spelling Bee/Early February:** The spelling bee offers friendly, educational competition for students in grades 1st - 4th (Fun Bee) and 5th - 8th (Spelling Bee).
- **Geography Bee:** The Geography Bee is for students in grades 4th -8th. Winners of the local spelling and geography competitions may advance on to regional and national levels.
- **Science Fair/Early March:** This event offers students in grades K-12 an opportunity to showcase their science projects, experiments, or demonstrations. In past years, educational opportunities have been offered at this event.
- **Winter Carnival/Early February:** Carnival atmosphere with games. This committee needs many members to operate the games!
- **Talent Show/Early April:** A showcase of our homeschooling community's many talents!
- **Annual Business Meeting and Spring Picnic/Late May:** We will meet at a local park for our annual business meeting and enjoy fellowship with one another.
- **Newsletter:** Periodic publication to inform and encourage members.
- **Graduation Committee/First meeting early October:** This committee is required of any family who wishes to graduate a student in the CHE sponsored graduation ceremony during the current school year. A chair is chosen at the first graduation meeting (held in early fall). Committee members share the responsibilities inherent in planning and conducting a graduation ceremony. CHE graduation is traditionally scheduled for the Saturday following MU's graduation weekend to assist with long-term planning. To participate in graduation, the membership application must be received by September 30th. Committee chair has the option of granting exceptions after September 30th.
- **Yearbook:** Each year teens produce a beautiful yearbook showcasing all CHE. Families are encouraged to submit photos throughout the year. Yearbook staff is advised by parents. (This is an advisor position not a full committee. This project is NOT funded through the CHE budget.)

CHE Social Groups*

The social groups provide CHE families the opportunity to get to know each other and develop friendships in a Christian atmosphere. Small committees of parents will meet their co-op obligation planning and facilitating activities for each social group. Social groups may be combined if a sufficient number of leaders are not available. Chaperoning/attendance alone does **not** meet the service obligation.

Unless otherwise advised a parent is expected to attend events with his/her children and act as chaperone.

***Teens:** The teen group provides social and/or educational activities for students ranging in age from 13 up to graduation. Teens must have a

signed code of conduct on file prior to participating in teen events or teen council.

***Teen Council:** A small leadership group of teens meeting monthly to learn leadership skills by participating in formal meeting to plan activities. (This is an advisor position not a full committee.)

***Pre-teens:** This group provides social and/or educational activities for students between the ages of 9 and 12.

***Young Explorers:** This group provides social and/or educational activities for students in Kindergarten to 10 years old.

***Bright Beginners:** This group provides social and/or educational activities for preschool students.
